NURTURING A NEXT-GEN BOND WITH ISRAEL

NF Australia continues to play a vital role in fostering a deep, personal connection between young Jewish Australians and the land and people of Israel. Through a dynamic education program, thousands of students - from primary school to high schoolers and youth movement participants – have experienced engaging, hands-on activities that inspire pride, understanding and lifelong ties to Israel.

Led by NSW Education Manager Hilli Lam, the program is designed to educate and empower. From the classroom to youth movement camps, students are introduced to the real impact of JNF Australia's projects on Israeli society, from reforestation and environmental initiatives to providing life-saving infrastructure in vulnerable communities.

"Our goal is to connect kids to Israel in a meaningful, relatable way," said Lam.

"When they understand the role they can play in shaping Israel's future, it becomes personal. It becomes part of their responsibility to undertake."

INF Australia education has two main programs; Chai and Seek, and Israeli Passport Peula. Chai and Seek is an

interactive mission-based challenge in which students complete tasks inspired by JNF's real projects in Israel, supporting displaced families, building water reservoirs and healing spaces. The goal is to introduce JNF's impact in a fun, engaging way that combines creativity, teamwork and Israeli spirit

The second program, Israeli Passport Peula, enables students to travel around different "cities" in Israel, completing activities and getting their Israeli passports stamped. Along the way, they learn about Israeli geography, culture (like matkot and

shoko besakit), and JNF's critical work.

Youth movement winter camps remain a yearly highlight, with Hineni, Bnei Akiva, Netzer, Habonim, Tzofim and Betar all welcoming JNF's educators.

"Camps are a special opportunity to connect with students beyond the classroom ... and strengthen their sense of Jewish identity and connection to Israel,"

"Especially now, it's more important than ever to share JNF's work and deepen the connection between our youth, their movements, and Israel."

In primary schools, students have explored Israel's geography, history and culture through creative activities like designing their own Blue Box tote bags, connecting them with the origin of JNF donations – the Blue Box.

In high schools, students learn about the real challenges Israelis face and the important role JNF Australia plays in responding to crises.

As part of the emergency campaign to fund bomb shelters, Lam worked with Hebrew students at Moriah College to connect them with Israeli students their own age who rely on these shelters for safety. "It's about empathy and awareness," she said.

For Jewish students in public schools, JNF partners with the Board of Jewish Education (BJE) to run sessions celebrating Israeli culture through food, dance, storytelling, and interactive games.

JNF Australia is proudly helping ensure that the next generation doesn't just learn about Israel – they feel part of it.
